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Polasaí Obair Bhaile i nGaelscoil Na Ríthe

- Is cuid lárnach d'oidreachas fiúntach, tairbheach é an obair bhaile.
- Cuidíonn obair bhaile leis an dalta tuiscint níos doimhne a fháil ar an obair ranga.
- Cleachtaíonn an dalta scileanna nua-foghlamtha.
- Tugtar deis don dalta obair neamhspleách a dhéanamh.
- Tugann obair bhaile aiseolas fiúntach don mhúinteoir faoi forbairt an dalta.
- Is nasc riachtanach é an obair bhaile idir an scoil agus an baile.

Cén Saghas Obair Bhaile?

Glacann obair bhaile foirmeacha éagsúla ag brath ar an topaic agus ar an ábhar.

De gnáth is cleachtadh atá i gceist ar obair an lae sin. Bíonn méascán de léitheoireacht, foghlaim agus scríbhneoireacht i gceist, de gnáth. Tá an léitheoireacht agus an fhoghlaim ar aon tábhacht leis an scríbhneoireacht.

Cé mhéad Obair Bhaile?

- Is treoirlínte iad seo don méid ama molta le caitheamh ar an obair bhaile. Caitheann páistí éagsúla méid ama difrúla ag déanamh an obair bhaile.
- Tugtar obair bhaile Dé Luan – Déardaoin. Anois agus arís tugtar obair bhaile ar an Aoine.

Rang	Tréimhse don Obair Bhaile
Náí Shóis agus Shins	0 - 20 nóiméad
Rang 1 agus 2	20 – 30 nóiméad
Rang 3 agus 4	30 -40 nóiméad
Rang 5 agus 6	40 – 50 nóiméad

Ról an Dalta

- An obair bhaile a scríobh sa dhialann roimh dheireadh an lae.
- Cinntiú go bhfuil an trealamh cuí aige/aici don obair bhaile roimh a théann sé/sí abhaile.
- An iarracht is fearr a dhéanamh agus é/í ag déanamh an obair bhaile.
- Dul siar ar tháblaí agus litriú gach oíche.

Ról an Tuismitheora/Chaomhnóra

- Ligigí do na páistí an obair bhaile a dhéanamh iad féin.
- An Dialann a shiniú gach oíche agus an méid ama a thóg sé an obair bhaile a dhéanamh a chlárú.
- Má thógann sé níos mó ná uair a chloig do do pháiste an obair bhaile a dhéanamh, cuir stop leis agus cuir nóta sa dialann.
- Tá sé tabhachtach éisteacht le litriú, táblaí agus léitheoireacht an pháiste.
- Cloí le modhanna múinte matamaitice na scoile ionas nach mbeidh an páiste meastha suas.
- Má tá cúis ann nach bhfuil an obair bhaile déanta cuir nóta sa dialann.

De gnáth tá sé mar pholasaí againn nach dtugaimid aon obair bhreise amach do pháistí atá ag dul ar laethanta saoire



Homework Policy at Gaelscoil na Ríthe

- Homework is a central part of a valuable and worthwhile education.
- Homework helps the pupil to a deeper understanding of class work.
- The pupil practises newly acquired skills.
- The pupil is given the opportunity to do independent work.
- Homework gives the teacher valuable feedback on the development of the pupil.
- Homework is an essential link between school and home.

What kind in Homework?

The type of Homework can vary based on the topic and the subject. It usually involves practice of the particular day's school work. There is usually a mixture of reading, learning/memorisation as well as written work. Reading and learning/memorisation are just as important as written work.

How much Homework?

- Below are guidelines on the amount of time that should be spent on Homework. Children differ in the amount of time that they spend on Homework.
- Homework is given from Monday to Thursday. From time to time Homework is given on Fridays.

Rang / Class	Homework period
Junior and Senior Infants	0-20 minutes
First and Second Class	20-30 minutes
Third and Fourth Class	30-40 minutes
Fifth and Sixth Class	40-50 minutes

The pupil's role

- To write down the Homework in his/her School Diary before the end of the school day.
- To ensure that he/she has the materials required for the Homework packed before going home.
- To give of his/her best in carrying out the Homework.
- To revise Tables and Spellings every night.

The Parent's/Guardian's role

- To allow the child to do the homework as independently as possible.
- To sign the School Diary every night and to record the amount of time taken in completing the Homework.
- To stop the Homework should it take more than an hour to complete and send a note to the teacher in the School Diary.
- It is important to listen to the child's Spellings, Tables and Reading.
- To stay with the school's methods in Mathematics to avoid confusing the child.
- To write a note of explanation in School Diary if Homework is not completed.

It is school practice not to give supplementary Homework to children going on vacation.
